# **LISTENING - 2**

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is the second level of the listening series. To take this course, students are supposed to have finished the Listening – 1. This is because Listening – 2 demands the competency that should have been achieved by finishing Listening – 1 course. That is to say, students will potentially have problems to take Listening-2 before they finish Listening-1.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

Upon the completion of this course, students should be able to understand spoken texts about past events and about how something works or takes place.

# **BASIC COMPETENCIES TO ACHIEVE**

- 1. Competency to understand spoken personal story
- 2. Competency to understand spoken biography or history
- 3. Competency to understand spoken news items
- 4. Competency to understand spoken explanation on how something is produced
- 5. Competency to understand spoken explanation on how something works
- 6. Competency to understand spoken explanation on how a natural phenomenon takes place
- 7. Competency to understand spoken explanation on how a social phenomenon takes place

# **ASSESSMENT**

The assessment will comprise 4 items:

- 1. Competency Test-1: To check students' competency in understanding spoken personal stories. (25%)
- 2. Competency Test-2: To check students' competency in understanding biography/history and news items (25%)
- 3. Competency Test-3: To check students' competency in understaning spoken explanation on how something is produced and how something works (25%)
- 4. Competency Test-4: To check students' competency in understanding spoken explanation on a social and natural phenomena (25%)

Plese note that your assignments submitted prior to each competency test will also contribute to the final mark.
